- 1. **Ask:** How can I engineer a catapult so it can make a plastic egg, holding 15 pennies, travel the farthest through the air? (Please tape egg securely!)
- 2. Imagine: Brainstorm possible ideas and solutions. Choose the best one.
- 3. Plan: Design, think, sketch, label. Draw a diagram. Gather needed materials.
- 4. Create: Follow the plan. Make a model and test it out.
- 5. **Improve:** Adjust your design to make it better. Make changes to your catapult and repeat the design process.


